### INTERNATIONAL CHILDREN'S PEACE PRIZE WINNER BARUANI NDUME ADDRESSES THE SCHOOL

It was our privilege to host International Children's Peace Prize Winner, Baruani, at Friday's Assembly. He was visiting the School with Zelda and Michaela Mycroft, from the Chaeli Foundation. Baruani gave a brief synopsis of his life story, having lived in Nyarugusu refugee camp in Tanzania since he fled the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) at the age of 7.

This is no ordinary young man. Baruani is a globally-acknowledged young change maker with first-hand knowledge and experience on children's rights and child and youth participation in a refugee context. This process began when, at the age of fourteen, he began a radio show, 'Sisi kwa Sisi' (Children for Children), aired between 2008 and 2010 on Radio Kwizera in Tanzania, DRC, Rwanda, and Burundi. Through the show, people of different generations were informed about children's rights and the situation of refugees. As the young show host, Baruani invited children to discuss the problems and challenges they faced in the refugee camp. By using the radio, Baruani's show contributed to reuniting over 50 children with their parents who were separated because of the war.

He has continued in this vein; he puts in all efforts to improve his situation and that of fellow children and youth in his community, contributing substantially to sustainable peace. Internationally, Baruani speaks out strongly on the impact of the current refugee crisis on the empowerment opportunities of youth. He is one of the many children and youth who have lived the larger parts of their lives in displacement, fundamentally disconnected from the outside world. Within Nyarugusu refugee camp, he also organised sports teams to create more understanding between children from different communities, and initiated women's literacy projects, and programmes to assist children who are new to the refugee camp.

The enormity of Baruani's achievements is evident when one considers that some 64 000 refugees are confined to Nyarugusu refugee camp, with some refugees having spent over 20 years in the camp without being able to leave.

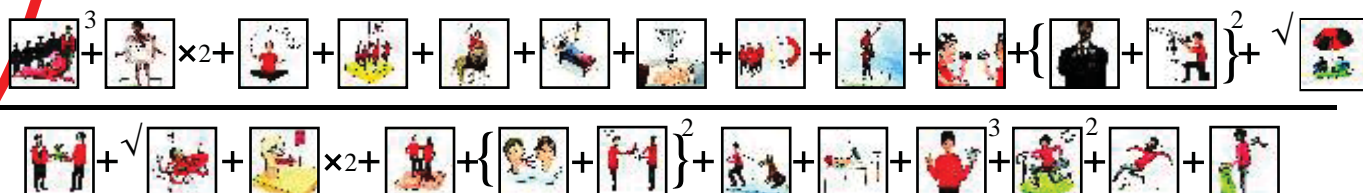

The final score was in the balance until the end of the match, with Jeppe defending well to win the match 24-17. Jeppe have enjoyed a really good season across Rugby and Hockey, and we commend them on their results.

Mention must be made of the Under 16 Rugby section, which ended what has been a very good season for them, with the U16A and U16B teams winning closely contested matches, and the U16C team securing a draw.

Overall, it was a very good weekend for the school, with our boys answering the call for the fixture to be treated as a 'home' fixture. There was a strong turnout of supporters on the Friday evening to support the 1st XI Hockey and excellent support on the Saturday for the Rugby. The support across the sports was evident. On giving a lift to a Grade 12 to Jeppe on Friday afternoon, I was pleased to have him comment: "Sir, the 1st Hockey boys came down to watch the last 1st XI Cricket match of the season in Term 1. 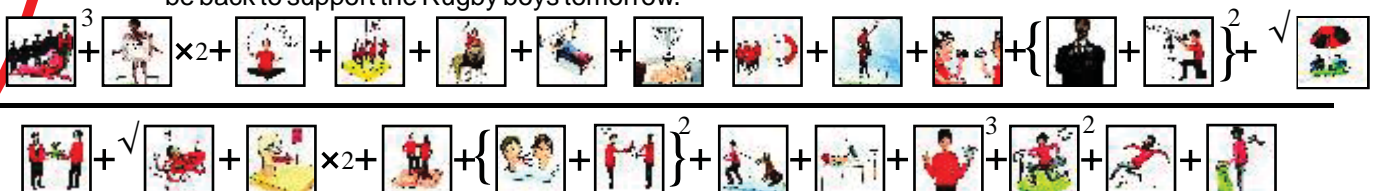

## **FORMIES DAY AND GRADE 9 PICNIC**

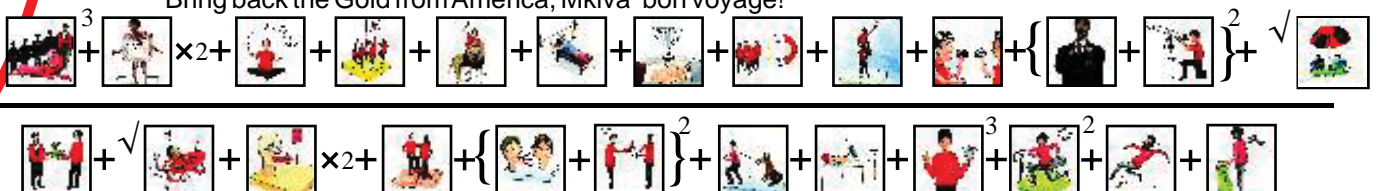
The school would like to extend its thanks to everyone who was involved in organising and executing the Formies Day and Grade 9 Picnic on Saturday, 3rd August 2019.

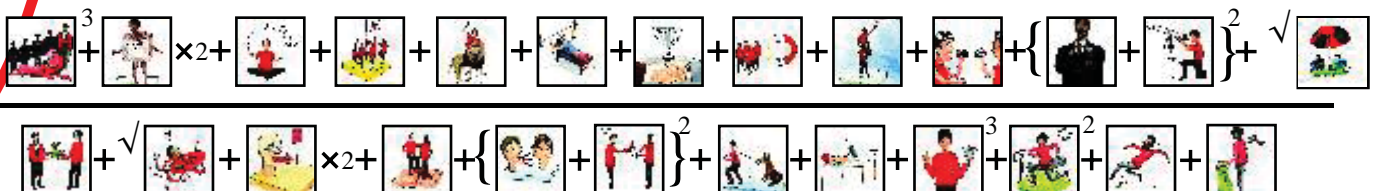
## SUPPORTING MENTAL HEALTH AWARENESS

The school welcomes **Mr Laurian Kruger as the new Master-in-Charge of Athletics** as he brings a renewed energy and excitement to this sporting section.

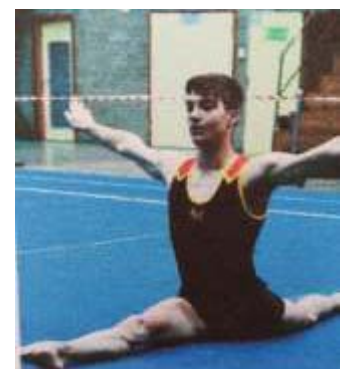
All A and B team players in our varied sporting codes at the school are required to participate in Athletics as it forms an essential part of their off-season conditioning.

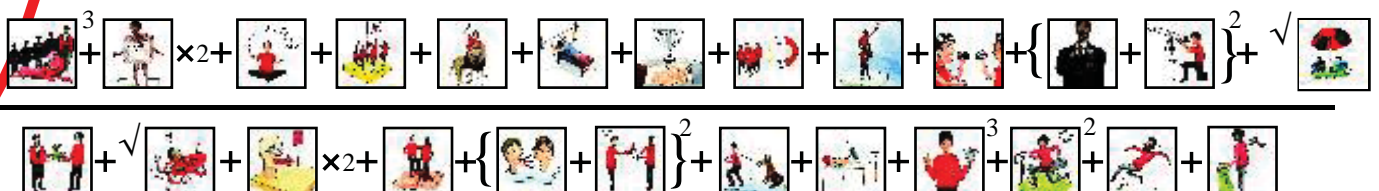

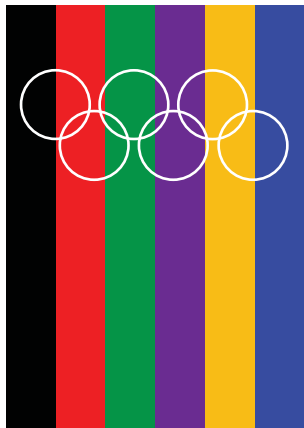

We are very proud of his achievements and we wish him all the best for the Nationals.





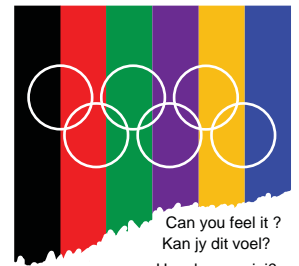

With the season kicking off next week, we look forward to having our parents and supporters motivating our boys on the touchline. Arise!

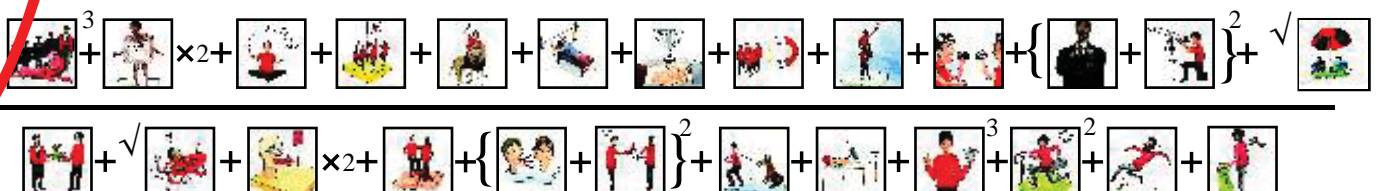

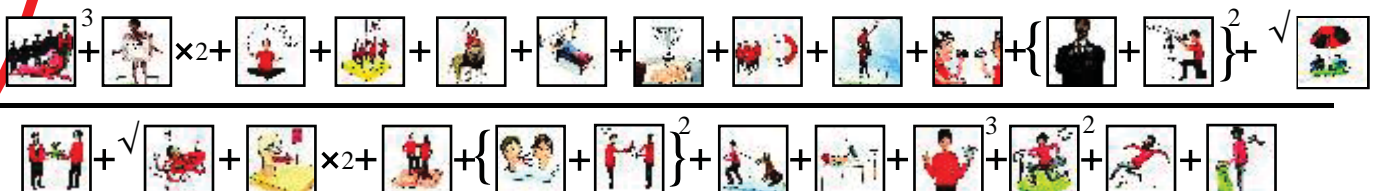
### MAJOR PRODUCTION 1 AUGUST

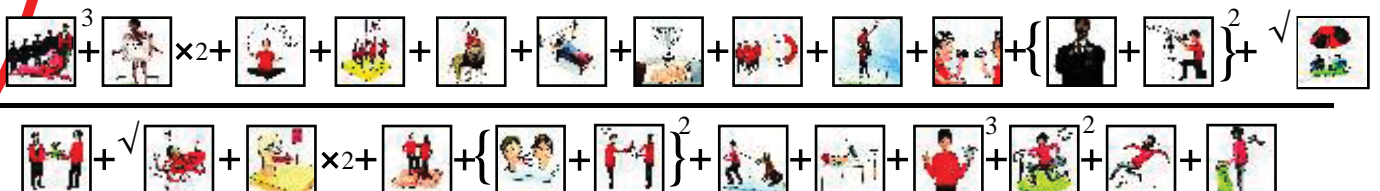

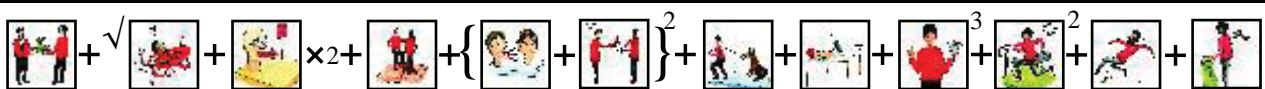

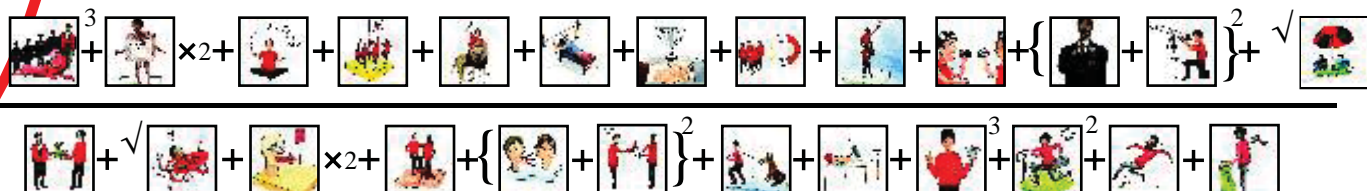
We wish to congratulate **Siyabonga Mbebe** who emerged as the Junior Best Speaker for 2019. Well done!

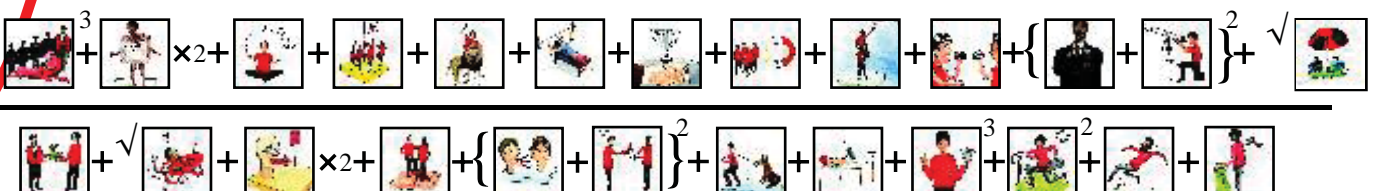
